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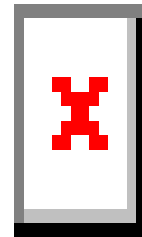

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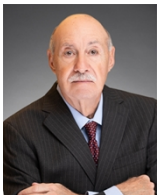

This edition of the *ETF Handbook* (the “Handbook”) provides easy access to key ETF documents, including rule 6c-11 (the “ETF Rule”) under the Investment Company Act of 1940, as amended (the “1940 Act”) and extracts from the ETF Rule's adopting release; a version of Form N-1A, the registration statement form used by most ETFs, which highlights the disclosure requirements unique to ETFs and the new disclosure requirements imposed by the ETF Rule; exemptive, no-action and interpretive relief from the Securities and Exchange Act of 1934, which is necessary for ETFs to trade on securities exchanges; the generic listing standards adopted by the national securities exchanges on which many ETFs rely in order to list their shares for trading; and certain guidance and letters from the Financial Industry Regulatory Authority applicable to ETF marketing materials.
