OVERVIEW

REPRESENTATIVE EXPERIENCE

- Represented ATech (Parent) Resolution Corp. (f/k/a Akoustis Technologies, Inc. (NASDAQ: AKTS), an integrated device manufacturer of high-band RF filters for mobile and other wireless applications) in an asset sale under Section 363 of the US Bankruptcy Code to Tune Holdings Corp., a subsidiary of SpaceX Exploration Technologies, a California-headquartered designer, manufacturer, and operator of advanced rockets and spacecrafts, for US\$30.2 million.

Our firm placed the company into a North Carolina receivership in June 2023.
